Que 2. Answer the following questions:

a) What is the difference between weather and climate?

Ans: Weather is the condition of the atmosphere at a particular place and time (like rain, sunshine, temperature, etc.).

Climate is the average weather condition of a place over a long period of time.

b) Why do places near the ocean have milder temperatures than places far away from it?

Ans: Places near the ocean have milder temperatures because water heats up and cools down slowly. So, coastal areas remain cooler in summer and warmer in winter.

c) What role do monsoon winds play in affecting India's climate?

Ans: Monsoon winds bring rainfall to most parts of India. They help in agriculture and greatly influence the temperature and weather conditions of the country.

d) Why is Chennai warm or hot throughout the year, while Leh is cold?

Ans: Chennai is near the sea and located in a tropical region, so it remains warm throughout the year. Leh is situated at a high altitude in the mountains, so it remains very cold.

- How do these factors affect the climate there?

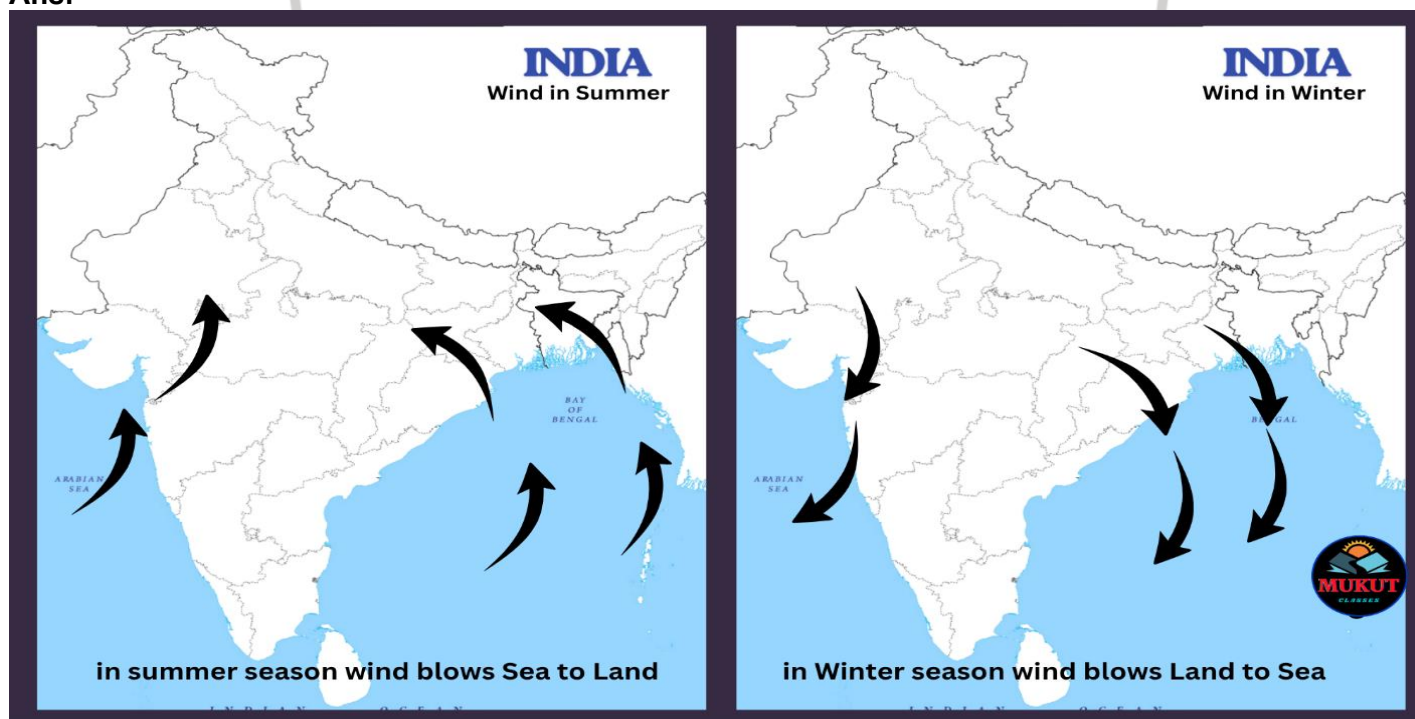

City	Location Type	Climate	Effect on Climate
Leh	Mountains	Very cold and dry	High altitude keeps the temperature very low
Chennai	Near the sea	Hot and humid	The sea keeps the climate warm and moist throughout the year.
Delhi	Plain area	Extreme climate	Summers are very hot and winters are cold because it is far from the sea
Panaji	Near the sea	Warm and humid	Arabian Sea causes heavy rainfall and moderate temperature
Jaipur	Desert area	Hot and dry	Desert conditions make summers very hot and rainfall low

Ans:

Floods

1. Floods are a common natural disaster in India.
2. They occur due to heavy rainfall, overflowing rivers, and cyclones.
3. Sometimes poor drainage systems and cutting of forests also increase floods.
4. Floods damage houses, roads, crops, and property.
5. Many people lose their homes and animals.
6. Water-borne diseases also spread after floods.

To reduce the impact of floods:

- **Individuals** should avoid throwing waste into drains and follow safety instructions.
- **Communities** should plant more trees and help in rescue work.
- **The government** should build strong embankments, improve drainage systems, and provide early warning systems.

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
